Development of **1-2-3 Door Shield** has been a high priority project for its innovator for quite a long time. From his early days running large, commercial and institutional development projects beginning in the late 1970s, he began to notice the haphazard and ineffective methods that had become status quo for protecting high quality doors during the final stages of the construction process. None of these 'Rube Goldberg' methods were effective and most made the problem worse. After documenting hundreds of bad examples of door protection, he decided to bring in the professionals and, relying heavily on his architectural and project management background, orchestrated a design team to find the right solution. That is how **1-2-3 Door Shield** came to be.

Design development, patent searches and ultimately submittal of a patent application to the U.S. Patent & Trademark Office encompassed many months of creative energy, testing and rejection of numerous product mock-ups. The goal, of course, was to design a cost-effective solution to the ongoing problem of doors being damaged on construction sites before they could even be used for their intended purpose.

Many of the early prototypes were somewhat effective, but they were either too expensive to manufacture, the components were such that they held a static charge and were, thus, unacceptable 'dirt catchers', or they lacked the durability needed in a construction environment. With the current embodiment of **1-2-3 Door Shield**, the best balance between cost and performance has been achieved and our extensive field testing has proven the product performs extremely well.

Manufacturing of **1-2-3 Door Shield** began in the summer of 2006 in Denver, Colorado and it has become an instant success in the Colorado market, with several of the top commercial builders already using the product.
